Our hearts unite in solidarity with all of the families around the world who have been affected by COVID-19. Today more than ever, we thank God for good health and the opportunity to continue our mission to save lives.

As we faced 2020 with great adversity and uncertainty, thanks to each and every one of you, we survived, reaching in our 29 years of work, 631,672 comprehensive health services provided free of charge.

We were forced to reduce outpatient care and focus on the most critical, including intensive care, cases, which increased as a result of confinement at home. The home has always been the epicenter of burns but COVID-19 exacerbated burn accidents. In our Cleft Lip and Palate program, we redirected resources to surgical

care, which is vital to bringing back our children's smiles.

The educational programs in Advanced Life Support (ABLS) for the immediate basic care of burned patients and burn prevention, were modified to virtual modality, a new experience, full of great challenges, but also great opportunities. We reached more health professionals and achieved a multiplier impact in the different sectors, both in the medical and in the school areas.

Our Regional Program was also adapted to a virtual modality, strengthening the quality and production of compressive garments, vital in the rehabilitation treatment of our children with burns.






Education & Prevention

- To decrease the incidence and prevalence of child burns, APROQUEN's burn prevention team conducts educational prevention workshops at preschools and elementary schools throughout Nicaragua's most underserved and high-risk communities.
- Due to limited access to health services in rural areas, APROQUEN's medical team travels throughout the country teaching health professionals how to stabilize a patient in the first 24 hours after a burn.
- With the support of different media outlets in Nicaragua, APROQUEN conducts an ongoing public education campaign for burn prevention.

Social Services

- APROQUEN provides free room and board for families in need at "Casa Albergue" so they can stay close to their children while they receive treatment.
- APROQUEN also provides formula and special bottles to help replace the caloric intake loss of those children born with cleft lip and palate.











Oliver Cruz is a charismatic and sweet boy who captivates everyone's heart. Unfortunately, his life has been hit multiple times. When he was only 9 years old, his mother left his sister Angoly, his father Jarvin and him for another romantic relationship. Jarvin and his mother are now the sole caretakers of Oliver and Angoly. They both work long and tiredly so Oliver and Angoly can finish their studies and have a better life.

Oliver loves to play baseball and one of his dreams is to learn how to speak English. He shares his bedroom with 12 other members of his family and in order to help pay for the household expenses, Oliver works with his father cutting coffee when in season. changed forever, as he suffered an accident that caused severe electrical burns to 10% of his body.

Oliver was traveling on the roof of a small truck when a loose cable got in the way and he tried to set it aside with his bare hand. Immediately a flow of high voltage electricity traveled through his body damaging internal organs, tissue and nerves. He was immediately taken to a Community Health Center in El Tuma- La Dalia to later be referred to a hospital in Matagalpa and finally to the APROQUEN'S Burn Center.

At APROQUEN doctors diagnosed him with second and third degree burns in his upper right limb, anterior trunk and both lower limbs. These burns were so severe that caused critical tissue damage in his right leg. After more than two weeks of intense surgical labor, doctors decided that due to the danger

the wound entailed they would need to amputate his right leg below the knee. In this moment Oliver's life changed forever.

Today, Oliver is on his journey to a full recovery with the support of APROQUEN's multidisciplinary team of medical professionals. Oliver and his father are forever grateful to this team that saved his life and realize the importance of a multidisciplinary approach to burn treatment. With only 14 years old and a life ahead of him, he has to adapt to living without his right leg. This, however, will never shatter his dream of learning English and becoming a successful professional that can give back to his family and community.

Thanks to your support and generosity, Oliver and many more children like him continue to chase their dreams and APROQUEN is able to continue... turning tears into smiles.

The Smile of a

Martha Emelina and Alfredo never imagined that their son, Mateo, would come test the importance of a strong and united family. When Martha Emelina was 4 months pregnant, she received a heart-wrenching news from her doctor. Mateo would be born with a cleft lip and palate.



Mateo was born on August 8, 2017 with a bilateral cleft lip and palate and 6 heart murmurs. From that moment on, Mateo became a warrior and against all odds, his parents decided to seek comprehensive and multidisciplinary medical care. Their priority from day 1 was to learn to feed their son

and above all, to take care of him so that he would grow up without being bullied or stigmatized.

The APROQUEN Medical Team met Mateo when he was only 8 days old and at 4 months old he had his first surgery. For Martha Emelina and Alfredo, the constant fear of an uncertain future for Mateo was constantly in their minds. It was never easy to see him wearing a naseoalveolar (NAM) orthodontic device but with the unwavering support of family the obstacles seemed and felt smaller.

Everyday tasks like brushing his teeth, feeding, playing, and learning to speak became challenges for Mateo. Everything that with his two older siblings followed very naturally, for Mateo was a process in which his health and emotional well-being were always tested.

Today, Mateo is 3 years old. He is a strong, happy, charismatic boy and above all, healthy. Very soon Mateo will start going to school and his parents' greatest wish is for him to start this integration into society without being a victim of bullying.

For Martha Emelina and Alfredo, the entire APROQUEN team has been key to the development of Mateo's thriving life and that of their entire family. Everyone from the doctors in charge of Mateo's treatments to the specialists who continue to empower the family to stand strong. Thanks to each and everyone of them Mateo's parents are confident that he will have a great future, in which his main lesson will be to never give up.







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Giving Back

The Story of Vivian Pellas

Dear Friends,

I would like to share with you a very personal story about an experience that completely changed my life and opened my heart to the world of burned children.

On October 21, 1989, my husband Carlos and I boarded a 727 of the Honduran airline TAN SAHSA, traveling from Managua to Tegucigalpa. Unfortunately, the plane never made it to Tegucigalpa, and instead crashed into Cerro de Hule at 7:50 a.m. The accident was described as the most tragic event in the history of Central American aviation as 139 lives were lost and only 10 survived.

Thanks to my husband who pulled me from the flames and God who is always watching over us, Carlos and I survived.

As I was drifting between life and death while being transferred via air ambulance from the hospital in Tegucigalpa to the United States my father heard me mumbling, "I am going to build a unit for the care of burned children." In gratitude to God that it had been Carlos and I and not our children that suffered the accident, I turned that thought into a commitment: APROQUEN was born in this moment.

In Gratituae

I can assure you that burn injuries challenge the boundaries of one's threshold for pain.
There were many times that I felt the smallest increase in the intensity of my suffering would most certainly be the cause of my death. But, it was not my time, and my life was ultimately spared after enduring the torturous pain caused by both my burn injuries and the 62 fractures across my face and body.

Today, there no words that can explain how I am still here. Every moment of every day I remember how lucky I am to be able to share new experiences with my husband, children and grandchildren.

I am here by the will of God. His divine plan has given me the opportunity to take on a mission for children and help "TURN TEARS INTO SMILES."
